

Update coronavirus outbreak – impact on freight and passenger transport in Italy

Italy

Following the surge of coronavirus cases in Italy, the Italian government published a new decree on March 1st 2020. According to the note published by the ANSA Agency - <u>www.ansa.it</u> - Italy has been split into four areas to face the coronavirus emergency. The red zone include the following cities:

- <u>Lombardia</u>: Bertonico, Casalpusterlengo, Castelgerundo, Castigione d'Adda, Codogno, Fombio, Maleo, San Fiorano, Somaglia, Terranova dei Passerini,
- <u>Veneto</u>: Vò

Specific measures in this red zone include:

- ban on access or removal from the municipal area,

- suspension of freight and passenger transport services (with the exception of the transport of essential and perishable goods)

- suspension of working activities for businesses, with the exception of the providing essential and public utility services.

For the entire territory, the decree is also enacting:

- the need for municipalities and trade associations to promote the dissemination of information on health and hygiene prevention measures in commercial establishments,

- the need for public transport companies, including long-distance ones, to take extraordinary measures to sanitize vehicles.
