

# Update on COVID-19 outbreak 12 March 2020

### Impact on freight and passenger transport

### **Austria**

Austria has introduced controls at the border with Italy. This has resulted in a backlog of trucks at borders and therefore the Tyrol Government have decided to lift the weekend driving ban for 14-15 March.

### **Denmark**

The Danish Government is investigating the possibility of imposing additional restrictions on entry into Denmark. Possible measures are: compulsory medical examination on arrival, compulsory quarantine on arrivals from red areas, denied entry to foreigners at the border if they arrive from red and orange areas.

Any action is taken with due regard to the maintenance of the necessary supply chains, including food supply and grocery market activities, to not hinder, as far as possible, companies' ability to receive deliveries from or export goods abroad.

### **Hungary**

Hungary announced yesterday evening that it was reinstating controls on its borders with neighbours Austria and Slovenia, in addition to banning travellers from Italy as well as China, Iran and South Korea.

#### Italy

All shops, restaurants and cafés will be closed 24/7, and businesses and factories will have to limit activities as much as possible, encouraging staff to take holidays or work from home. Supermarkets and pharmacies, as well as post offices and banks, will remain open. Public transport will continue to run. The new measures will last for two weeks.

### <u>Macedonia</u>

National and international passenger transport in Macedonia is restricted. According to Amerit, the only border crossing with Serbia which is open for transport and transit is Preshevo – Tabanovce.

## **Slovenia**
